REGULAR TOWN COUNCIL MEETING
MONDAY APRIL 9, 2001 – 7:00 P. M.
CENTRAL TOWN HALL – 105 WERNER STREET

Present: Mayor Stan Thompson; Councilpersons: Keith Martin, Harry Holladay, Bobby Busha, Frank Chaka. Administrator Herbert Thompson; Greg Oliver, Central-Clemson Observer; Mollie Ferrloan, The Messenger; Grace Towe, Clerk.

Mayor Stan Thompson called the regular Town Council meeting to order at 7:00 P. M.

Invocation by Harry Holladay.

- A. Reading of the Special Called Council meeting minutes of 03-05-01. Motion by Keith Martin and seconded by Harry Holladay to dispense with the full reading of the minutes and adopt as a second corrected copy. The vote was unanimous.
- B. Reading of the Regular Council meeting minutes of 03-12-01. Motion by Keith Martin and seconded by Harry Holladay to dispense with the full reading of the minutes and adopt as corrected in work session. The vote was unanimous.
- C. Reading of the Special Called Council meeting minutes of 04-02-01. After correction to read "Assistant Municipal Judges" a motion was made by Keith Martin and seconded by Harry Holladay to adopt. The vote was unanimous.

Public Session (30 minutes) No input.

Report from Council Committees:

Keith Martin – Recreation – Mr. Martin gave an update on the Central-Clemson Recreation Board and stated that the facility is doing a good job with fund-raising and the general operation of the facility.

Harry Holladay – Planning – Mr. Holladay again stated his desire to see power lines on Main Street and Werner Street put under ground. He stated this would be a good long range plan for the town. He discussed the old Hunter Barber shop and the need of restoration in the future. Mayor Thompson suggested referring this item to the Heritage Society.

Bobby Busha – Streets and Sanitation - Mr. Busha discussed junk cars on Eaton Street. Mayor Thompson informed Mr. Busha that this item is for the police department to investigate.

Consideration of Ordinances in possession of Council:

Second reading of Ordinance #3-12-01-W to increase water rates. Mayor

Thompson called for a motion to dispense with the full reading of the ordinance and adopt on second reading. Motion by Bobby Busha and seconded by Keith Martin to adopt. The vote was unanimous.

Second reading of Ordinance #3-12-01-W-S-T to increase water tap and sewer tap fees. Mayor Thompson called for a motion to dispense with the full reading of the ordinance and adopt on second reading. Motion by Keith Martin and seconded by Bobby Busha to adopt. The vote was unanimous.

Report from Mayor and Administrator:

A. Administrator's Report:

Administrator Herbert Thompson reported that Pickens County will not impose an Inflow and Infiltration fee until July 1, 2001 and hopes of some relief would be welcomed; however, it appears that it will be an increase instead of a decrease.

Mr. Thompson reported that Pickens County is to finance a new recycling truck for the five municipalities in Pickens County.

Southern Wesleyan University is starting an office paper recycling project. It will be picked up at curbside.

Mr. Thompson discussed the proposed Pickens County road fee @20.00 per vehicle and more information will be forthcoming on this item.

Mayor's Report:

Mayor Thompson reported that Ms. Debbie Cumbie's term on the governing board of the Central-Clemson Recreation Center will expire next meeting. Ms. Cumbie has agreed to serve another three year term on the board. A motion was made by Bobby Busha and seconded by Keith Martin to reappoint Ms. Cumbie to serve another three year term. The vote was unanimous.

Mayor Thompson discussed the Personnel Policy manual and Administrator Herbert Thompson went over the portion of the manual dealing with grievance. After discussion and corrections to this portion of the manual, motion by Keith Martin and seconded by Frank Chaka to adopt the manual as discussed in last work session and finished in session tonight. The vote was unanimous.

There being no further business a motion was made by Keith Martin and seconded by Bobby Busha to adjourn. The vote was unanimous.
