January 4, 1971

A regular meeting of the Town Council was held on Monday, January 4, 1971 at 7:00 P. M. at the Town Hall with the following attending: Mayor, H. R. Holladay, Councilmen George Fowler, A. B. Cumbie, Jr., Glen D. O'Dell, Herbert Thompson, Jr., J. R. Herd and Jack Kennemore. Also present for the meeting were Mrs. Maude Chapman representing the Messenger and Mr. E. L. Bolick with the Cannon Mills Company.

There was a lengthy discussion of the 10% Water Increase and the 50% Sewerage Surcharge which will be reflected in the water billing for January, 1971. Mr. E. L. Bolick, superintendent of Cannon Mills, met with the Town Council and told the Council that only about 10 percent of the water they used per month went into the sewerage system. Most of the water used in the plant is for the sizing of warps and steam to maintain the required humidity. After discussions on this matter, Councilman Cumbie made a motion, seconded by Councilman O'Dell, that we contact our Engineer and ask his recommendations as to what percentage to charge Cannon Mills Co., and etc. for their Sewerage Surcharge Use. This motion was carried unanimously.

The minutes of the last regular meeting and two special call meetings were read and approved.

There was some discussion on the request to provide water for residents on the Eighteen Mile Creek Road, but no action was taken.

Some discussion was held on the erecting of street lights that had already been approved. The Council voted to delay the installation of said lights until the rates could be determined, as some of the mercury lights cost more than others.

The Council approved construction of a water line to ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~ serve the Earle Maw, Jr. home but did not approve the request for Sewerage.

Recommendations for additional water lines for residents having low water pressure was discussed. These include lines serving the T.P. Kelley's, Seaborns, C. B. Bryan, Kenneth Dobsons, and the J. E. Kelley's. Councilman Cumbie made a motion, seconded by Councilman Fowler, to install a 2" Water line in the T. P. Kelley's area, approximate cost to be about \$180.00. Councilman Fowler made a motion to proceed with the Kenneth Dobson and J. E. Kelley Water Line. This motion was seconded by Councilman O'Dell. All motions pertaining to said water lines were unanimously approved.

A discussion was held on fire protection for rural residents outside Central town limits. Discussion included the rates per year for fire protection, boundary lines, the effective date and etc. It was decided to try to determine the boundary lines with the drawing of a map and etc. and try to come to some definite decision at the next

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regular Town Council Meeting.


Some discussion was held on the pay for the Fire Calls to the volunteer Firemen. Councilman Kennemore made a motion to raise the pay from \$2.00 per call to \$3.00 per call. This motion was seconded by Councilman Cumbie, and vote was unanimously carried.

It was also voted to purchase a battery for the International Fire Truck.
