January 5, 1970

A regular meeting of the Town Council was held on Monday, January 5, 1970 at 7:00 P. M. with the following attending: Mayor, L. S. Griffin, Councilmen J. R. Herd, W. W. Norwood, George Fowler, A. R. Cureton, and Herbert Thompson, Jr.

Mayor L. S. Griffin presided over the meeting. The minutes of the last meeting and two special call meetings were read and approved.

There was a lengthy discussion on the proposed annexation of residents wanting to come into the Town of Central.

There was also a lengthy discussion on the Sewerage Problem of Mr. Maw's .

The Mayor made an announcement of the acknowledgement of the order of the new Police Car. There was some discussion on the equipment for the new car, especially pointing to the decals and also the "screen". Councilman Thompson made a motion seconded by Councilman Norwood that we purchase a "screen" for the new car. This vote was unanimously carried. It was decided to wait until the delivery of the car to order the decals.

A letter from the Central Improvement was presented before the Council, and Mr. Harry Davis explained what the Club was doing in the athletic program and what the donation would be used for. After some discussion Councilman Herd made a motion seconded by Councilman Cureton that we give to the Central Community Improvement Club \$150.00 now and then decide on the amount to be given them at a later date. This vote was carried.

Mr. Brendle met with the Town Council and talked at length about a proposed zoning system for the Town. No action was taken on this matter.

There was much discussion concerning the employment of Mr. A. C. Arnold, Police Chief. After discussion, Councilman Fowler made a motion, seconded by Councilman Thompson that Chief Arnold be asked for his resignation, the date to be effective on January 16, 1970. The vote was carried, in that four Councilmen voted to let Chief go and one voted to keep Chief. The motion was also that Chief Arnold would receive two full weeks pay beyond the said date of resignation.

Being no further business the meeting adjourned.
