Rogers & Callicot Engineering reported that it would take some engineering cost to determine feasibility of placing a pump station to service both existing system and Pratt Read and make an alternative. Motion by Rollins seconded by Porter to talk with Pratt Read about feasibility of pump station in cooperative with town. Council approved.

The Church of God on College St. wants to purchase the property belonging to the Town behind the Church of God known as the Old Filter Plant. Motion by Rollins seconded by Thompson that we sell the property at the Old Filter Plant.

Motion by Rollins seconded by Porter to accept the Homestead exemption tax for municipalities which will reduce ad valorem tax for Homestead exemption that will be reimbursed by the state if passed through Senate. Council approve.

Motion by Porter seconded by Boyles that the Town of Central join into the Municipal Association management program for unemployment compensation. Motion carried.




Mrs. Boyles asked the question as to whether the Spring Forest Shopping Center would be brought into the town. Langston said that he would come into the city.


Motion by Rollins seconded by Porter to purchase a car for the Police Dept. from the lowest bidder.
