A regular meeting of the Town Council was held on Monday, February 2, 1970 at 7:00 P. M. with the following attending: Mayor, L. S. Griffin, Councilmen C. B. Bryan, George Fowler, J. R. Herd, A. R. Cureton, W. W. Norwood, & Herbert Thompson, Jr. Also present for the Meeting was Mr. Jerry Alexander with the Anderson Independent.

Mayor Griffin presided over the meeting. The minutes of the last meeting and two special call meetings were read and approved.

Police Chief, Wess Adams, gave his police report from the period of January 16-31st., 1970. During this period there were a total of six (6) arrests made and \$225.00 collected. Chief Adams made a request for the Council to consider the purchasing of a radio for the new police car. There was a lengthy discussion on this request. Councilman Fowler made a motion, seconded by Councilman Thompson, that the radio be purchased provided that the Town of Central could get on the Pickens County Sheriff's Department currency, and also provided that the Town of Central could get the 60% deduction on the radio from the Appalachian Funds. This vote was unanimously carried.

Mayor L. S. Griffin made a report to the Council that the South Carolina Regional Housing Authority would like to attempt to expand their housing units in the Town of Central. There was considerable discussion on this report. Councilman Herd made a motion, seconded by Councilman Bryan, that we request the Housing Project to expand within the Town of Central, if they could get the land needed and etc. This vote was unanimously carried.

The 18 Mile Creek Water District made a request that the waterworks dam in the 18 Mile Creek be removed to drain the creek bed. After some discussion, Councilman Bryan made a motion, seconded by Councilman Fowler, that the 18 Mile Creek Watershed District be allowed to remove the dam providing that the Town of Central receive the salvage value of the steel that is removed from the creek bed, if the be salvage value. This vote was carried. Five Councilmen voted in favor of this motion and one Councilman voted against this motion.

A request was made by Harry Davis that the Town of Central pay for two trophies, one for the boys and one for the girls most outstanding player. Councilman Norwood made a motion, seconded by Councilman Cureton that about \$40.00 be spent for this purpose. This vote was unanimously carried.

All matters pertaining to the Street and Police Department be handled through the Committee of Councilman Cureton and Councilman Fowler.

The Council also voted to purchase an extra fire hydrant.

Being no further business the meeting adjourned.
