February 5, 1962

The Town Council met Monday night, February 5, 1962, with the following attending: Mayor S.C. Carson, Councilmen C.B. Bryan, J.A. Cranford, J.J. Canup and R.A. Busha. Mrs. Maude Chapman with the Messenger Newspaper, Mrs. Joe Marrett with the Monitor and Mr. Bob Bradey with the Greenville News.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The Council read bids from three station operators on gas, oil, antifreeze and grease jobs for the Town equipment. Mr. Cranford made a motion that the Town accept the 3¢ discount on gas ^{and} pay the regular price on grease, oil, antifreeze & etc., and to purchase tires and tubes from the lowest bidder when needed. Mr. Bryan seconded the motion. The Council agreed. These bids were accepted from the Red Diamond Oil Co., Esso Service Center, R.T. Martin's Esso Station. A form letter is to be sent to Sim's Amoco Station and Evatts Gulf Station to be signed and returned if interested in giving a 3% discount on gas ^{if agreed}, if so alternating between the five stations would continue, if not the three stations giving the discount would do the servicing of the Town equipment.

The Council voted to pay Mr. Busha \$25.00 for helping install the Christmas lights, pay Bobby Stancil \$10.00, ~~and~~ for acting as Santa Claus in the Christmas Program and to give Daniel Band \$25.00 for entertainment. *This money to be paid from the Christmas Fund.*

The Clerk's salary was discussed. Mr. Canup made a motion that the clerk's salary be raised from \$55.00 per week to \$60.00 per week. Mr. Bryan seconded the motion. The Council agreed.

The Central Grammer School Bldg. which has been vacated was discussed, as being used for a City Hall, Library for Town Equipment and for offices for other organizations. Mr. Carson explained that it would not be ~~deeded~~ to any organization or to the Town, but three trustees would be appointed every two or three years, to be in charge of it, and that the Town would not be responsible for the upkeep of the bldg.

The Council agreed to send out final notices on City Taxes, stating if taxes are not paid on or by April 15, 1962, said taxes will go into execution to secure payment.


Installing water & sewer lines in sub-divisions, A Moselumn
