Minutes

The minutes of the Regular February Meeting were read by the Clerk. Motion by Mr. Chaka, seconded by Mr. Porter to adopt-vote unanimous.

The minutes of the Special February Meeting were read by the Clerk. Motion by Mr. Chaka, second by Mr. Gambrell to adopt-vote unanimous.

Council Reports

Mr. Evatt: Asked that plans be made for the Spring Baseball and Softball programs.

Mr. Rampey's Police report was presented by Administrator.

Mr. Sims was absent.

Mr. Porter-no report.

Mr. Chaka-no report.

Mr. Gambrell presented the financial report.

Administrator's Report

Administrator requested permission to convert two vehicles to propane on a trial basis. Motion by Gambrell; second by Chaka to approve. Vote unanimous.

Administrator presented finding of Rogers & Calcott on pressure problems on Highway 18.

Mr. Gambrell raised question of buses not using new road to Elementary School. Administrator agreed to request that buses use this road.

New Business

Mayor reviewed Planning Commission actions:

1. Randy Newton's Final Plat approved by Planning Commission.
2. Carl James request to sub-divide his property approved.
3. Grant-Davis rezoning tabled pending further investigation as to building situation; other matters.

ABC License (Beer & Wine) for Sonny Burger

Mayor explained the process for obtaining a license. Discussion was heard from all Council members opposing the issuance of said license. Motion by Gambrell to protest the license; seconded by Evatt-vote unanimous.

The Mayor reported to the Council on the Municipal Association trip. He noted that Central would be receiving state grant funds. He also thanked Council for the opportunity to attend.

Motion by Gambrell; second Chaka to go into Executive Session. Vote unanimous.

Executive Session

Motion by Porter; second Gambrell to give Queen a 4% raise. Vote unanimous.

Also discussed was Mr. Robert Newton's contract proposal to deed Heatherwood Sewerage Lagoon to Central. Council expressed no desire to accept unless annexation could be guaranteed for Heatherwood and East Briar.
