

Regular Council Meeting March 10, 1986

Mayor Cumbie called the meeting to order.
Invocation by Mr. Frank Chaka.

Minutes of the February 10, 1986 meeting were read. Motion by Mr. Chaka, second by Mr. Law to adopt. Vote unanimous.

OLD BUSINESS:

Mr. Law--Noted that with the exception of one the water connections on Gassaway Street had been completed. Line had been looped on Hwy 18 to resolve the problem of bleeding a fire hydrant every week. Met with Central Textiles concerning dumping at south plant, agreement with Mr. Garrick being worked out.

Mr. Chaka---gave police report noting noting that Officer William Stephens had resigned as Animal Control Officer and Officer Johnny Williams had accepted the job.

Enforce one hour parking on main street. Merchants agree to cooperate.

Mr. Phillips--Noted the ware house on Gaines St, property of Pendleton Oil Mill could be hazardous to children playing around it because of the collapsed roof.

Mr. Gambrell to contact Pendleton Oil Mill concerning problem.

Mr. Gambrell asked for clarification as to the amount to go toward baseball . . .

Motion by Mr. Porter, second by Mr. Law to give \$250.00 toward ~~baseball~~ and view the situation each year. Vote unanimous. *Soft Ball*
