April 2, 1964

The Town Council met Thursday night, April 2, 1964, with the following attending: Mayor Cranford, Councilmen B.B. Bryan, J.L. Martin, R.A. Busha and W. J. Wilson.

Mayor Cranford presided. The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

A discussion was held on merchants putting garbage bins behind each store in order to keep garbage from being scattered. Winn Dixie Store and Central Hdwe. Co. have agreed to have this done and Mr. Cranford said that he would talk with other merchants about this futher.

Mr. Busha made a motion that any maintenance men installing water lines, sewer lines, gas lines and etc. be responsible for repairing any streets torn up in ~~fixing~~ doing this work, and that all sewer lines be connected directly to sewer main line instead of the manhole and that an Ordinance be drawn up to this effect. Mr. Wilson seconded the motion. The Council agreed. Mr. Busha also made a motion that an ordinance be drawn up for having only one water meter to each dwelling, except for trailers only on temporary basis. (The Council would decide on temporary basis). The Council agreed.

A discussion was held on the sewer problem on West Main St. Mr. Cranford said that he would have Beeson Engineering Co. to survey the situation and see if more residents could be benefited from this line.

Mr. Cranford announced that Mr. Claude Thomas had applied for a license to open a liquor store within the city limits of the Town of Central. Mr. Bryan made a motion that the Council vote no against this license. Mr. Busha seconded the motion. The Council agreed.

Mr. Cranford announced that the Town Council and Mayor had signed an option for property to the Post Office Department for a new Post Office building.

Mr. Wilson mentioned that J.D. Horton had contacted him concerning something being done in order for him to pump more sand from eighteen creek. No decision was made on this.

Mr. Wilson made a motion that liability insurance be secured for the water tank. Mr. Bryan seconded the motion. The council voted favorable.

Being no futher business the meeting was adjourned.
