A regular meeting of the Town Council was held on Friday, April 4, 1969 at 7:00 P. M. with the following attending: Mayor L. S. Griffin, Councilmen W. W. Norwood, Herbert Thompson, Jr., George Fowler, J. R. Herd, and A. R. Cureton.

Mayor Griffin presided over the meeting. The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved, and also one call meeting.

The question of rent on the present Town Hall and Fire Station was discussed. After some discussion on this matter Councilman Norwood made a motion, seconded by Councilman Herd that we pay for three more months rent on the buildings. All Council agreed.

The question of Liability Insurance on the Water Tank was discussed. After some discussion, Councilman Cureton made a motion, seconded by Councilman Thompson, to check with Ross Kelley and get the prices of this insurance, and if it is as cheap or cheaper than the price of Carl Byars, to take it with Ross Kelley, and if not to keep it with Byars. This motion was unanimously carried.

A letter from the Central Chamber of Commerce was read to the Council calling the attention to some of the unsightly conditions that exist in the Town and asking that we put forth whatever efforts possible to help clear up undesirable areas. Several comments were made pertaining to this letter, and a motion was made by Councilman Norwood, seconded by Councilman Fowler, that an Ordinance be published in the Messenger paper reminding the people that there is an ordinance against the littering of the Town and also reminding them that to do such littering is unlawful. This vote was unanimously carried. It was also agreed to have April as the Clean-Up Month and to designate this in connection with the littering of the Town.

It came to the attention of the Council and several people had made complaints regarding the chicken coops and the dead chickens that were unloaded at the Holladay Hatchery Building. After discussions were made, Councilman Cureton made a motion, seconded by Councilman Thompson that Mr. Holladay be notified and ask him to move them by Easter Sunday morning. This vote was unanimously carried.

The question of the signs for the New Town Office and Fire Station were brought before the Council. It was decided to have Mr. Glenn Carson decide on the signs for the new building.

Being no futher business the meeting adjourned.
