April 6, 1970

A regular meeting of the Town Council was held on Monday, April 6, 1970 at 7:00 P. M. with the following attending: Mayor, L. S. Griffin, Councilmen J. R. Herd, W. W. Norwood, Herbert Thompson, Jr., George Fowler, and A. R. Cureton. Also present for the Meeting was Mrs. Maude Chapman representing the Messenger.

Mayor Griffin presided over the meeting. The minutes of the last Meeting and one special call meeting were read and approved.

Police Chief, Wess Adams, gave his report from the period of March 1st. - 31st., 1970. During this time there were a total of 20 arrest made and \$480.00 collected.

Police Chief, Wess Adams, made a request from the Town Council, to send him to an ammunition school for one day for instructions on firearms, which would cost approximately \$15.00. After discussion, Councilman Cureton made a motion, seconded by Councilman Fowler to send Chief Adams to the school. This vote was carried.

It was reported to the Town Council that the Mac Fire Truck was in need of repair on the tank. After a lengthy discussion, Councilman Herd made a motion, seconded by Councilman Norwood, that we have the truck repaired, so long as it did not exceed \$200.00. This vote was unanimously carried.

The Central Improvement Club asked permission for a street dance to be held on June 20, 1970. There was some discussion on this subject, and then it was voted not to have the dance. Also there was a request from the Central Improvement Club for a donation to help on the Recreation Program. It was voted to give the Central Improvement Club a \$100.00 donation and also the old police car, provided they dispose of the car within sixty (60) days of April 6, 1970. Councilman Cureton made the motion, seconded by Councilman Herd. This vote was unanimously carried.

It was reported that a U. S. Flag had been bought for the Town of Central, and a motion was made by Councilman Norwood, seconded by Councilman Cureton that the Mayor be reimbursed for the flag. This vote was unanimously carried.

The Town Council voted to pay for the food and etc. for a dinner for all the workers that contributed their services during the construction of the Town Hall and Fire Station.

Being no further business the meeting adjourned.
