MINUTES - - - - -South Carolina

The regular monthly meeting of the Town Council was held on May 3, 1944 at 5 P. M. and the following were present: G. M. Perry, Mayor; W. A. Gaines, Chief of Police; C. F. James, J. W. Wallace, Doyle Elrod, Greedy Derry, C. B. Bryan and G. T. Newton, Councilmembers.

The meeting was called to order by the Mayor an agreement with the Southern Railway was brought up by Mr. Perry and he asked the Council to draw up a resolution for him to sign this agreement with the Railway. The agreement was prepared by the Southern Railway Company and it is similar to ones which we now have with them. J. W. Wallace made a motion that the Council pass this resolution, Doyle Elrod 2nd the motion. Mr. Perry asked if there was any discussion and G. T. Newton asked if this crossing was pipe in concrete casing. The pipe is not in concrete it is 6" cast iron pipe in 12" iron pipe. This vote was unanimous.

The taxes were discussed and a budget drawn up. A round table discussion was carried on and J. W. Wallace made motion that the tax millage be \$7 mills, this vote was 2nd by C. B. Bryan. A vote was carried and it was unanimous.

The water extension was the next topic and Mr. Perry asked the Council about running a line under the highway and putting a 6" pipe over on the highway next to the school. This was on Oakhurst, G. T. Newton though this was a good idea. The Council agreed on this matter.

J. W. Wallace made motion that we have council meeting at 5 P. M. C. F. James 2nd this motion. The Council agreed upon this.

The Council asked about selling beer on Sunday in Town, there has been some talk of it. Mr. Gaines said he had been watching this very close and if anyone was selling beer he didn't know it.

Mr. Gaines asked the Council about Bob Ashley wanting to mark off in front of the Theatre. This was not a good idea the council though this should not be done.

The meeting then adjourned.
