CENTRAL, S. C.

The Town Council met Thursday Night, May 3, 1962, 7:0'clock P.M. at the Town Hall with the following attending: Mayor S.C. Carson, Councilmen C.B. Bryan, J.J. Canup, R.A. Busha, W.J. Wilson and representatives from the Greenville News and Messenger Papers.

Mayor Carson presided. The minutes of the last meeting were read. Mr. Busha made a motion that the minutes be adopted. Mr. Wilson seconded the motion.

Each Councilmen read the ordinances drawn up by the Town Attorney, John Gentry, for Excessive Noise and Spitting on the Streets. Mr. Bryan made a motion the ordinance for excessive noise be adopted. Mr. Canup seconded the motion. Mr. Canup made a motion the ordinance for spitting on the streets be adopted. Mr. Busha seconded the motion. The Council agreed to adopt both ordinances.

A discussion was held on Firemen being paid more if they answer calls and stay with the Fire Chief and help with putting up the hose and refilling the tank. Mr. Busha made a motion Firemen answering calls and staying with the Fire Chief to help with the hose and refilling of the tank be paid \$1.00 extra for each call. Mr. Canup seconded the motion. The Council agreed.

Mr. Wilson said that Mr. J.D. Walker had requested a street light to be put near his home on Coker Circle. Mr. Carson appointed Mr. Canup and Mr. Wilson to check on the lights.

The Council discussed buying a small lawn mower for cutting grass in areas to close for the tractor mower. Mr. Busha made a motion that a lawn mower be bought. Mr. Bryan seconded the motion. The Council decided to let Chief Beams be in charge of purchasing the mower.

Mr. Wilson read a letter which Mr. Carson had received from Senator Olin D. Johnston concerning a new Post Office for Central.

Being no futher business the Council adjourned.
