A regular meeting of the Town Council was held on Monday, May 4, 1970 at 7:00 P. M. with the following attending: Mayor, L. S. Griffin, Councilmen George Fowler, J. R. Herd, Herbert Thompson, Jr., and W. W. Norwood. Also present for the Meeting were Mr. L. E. Merck and Mrs. Maude Chapman.

Mayor Griffin presided over the meeting. The minutes of the last Meeting and one special call meeting were read and approved.

Mr. L. E. Merck, with the S. C. Law Enforcement Division, was present and gave his report of the arrest made on the Police Force since he had been working in the Central area. Councilmen present commended Mr. Merck for the outstanding job he was doing for the Town of Central. Councilman W. W. Norwood made a motion, seconded by Councilman Thompson, that a letter be written to Chief Strom with the S. C. Law Enforcement Division in Columbia, S. C. in appreciation of the work that Mr. L. E. Merck had done for the Town. This vote was unanimously carried.

The ~~arrangement~~ <sup>matter</sup> of the Firemen's Convention to be held in Charleston, S. C. on June 6th.-9th., 1970 was brought before the Council for discussion. After discussion, a motion was made by Councilman Fowler, seconded by Councilman Herd, that the Town of Central send Fire Chief, John Head and Furman Gossett & their wives to the Convention and also pay for two nights (for the four) hotel, meals and mileage. This vote was unanimously carried.

The Central Rescue Squad made a request that the Town of Central have a telephone installed for the Resque Squad use only. There was some discussion on this request, and it was decided to talk to the County and see if they would handle this situation with the squad.

A report was made to the Town Council of stray dogs about and over the Town and also dogs without inoculation. A motion was made by Councilman Fowler seconded by Councilman Herd to have the dog catcher come down from Pickens and work in the Central area to try and clear this problem. This was unanimously adopted.

The question of Robert Wardlaw's pay for part-time work for one week was brought before the Council. After some discussion, Councilman Thompson made a motion seconded by Councilman Fowler to pay Robert for a full week's wages. This was unanimous.

Being no further business the meeting adjourned.
