MINUTES * * * * * * * * * * South Carolina

At the regular monthly meeting held Monday night June 2, 1952 at 7:30 P. M. the following were present: G. M. Perry, Mayor; W. A. Gaines, Chief of Police, Councilmembers: C. F. James, S. C. Carson, J. W. Wallace, Jr., and Frank Abercrombia.

The first discussion after the meeting was called to order was a letter Mr. Cumbia, Chairman of the Fire Prevention Committee of the Junior Chamber of Commerce to Mr. Pye, Chief Engineer of the South-Eastern Underwriters Association. The letter was read by Mr. Perry and also our answering letter to Mr. Cumbie. Our fire hose was then talked about and the council asked Mr. Gaines to get all of our fire hose together and see how many feet we have. In Mr. Pye letter it was mentioned that Central was slated for a fire inspection later on this year. Mr. Perry says that if a fire inspection was now our fire rates would be raised because our volunteer fire department is not active. The council agreed that we should get a new fire department functioning and get sufficient fire hose. The council agreed to let the Jaycees elect Fire men and the council will okay them.

Our finance was discussed and the council talked about changing the money from Easley Bank to Fort Hill Bank, due to the fact that we have to get money orders and send them to the bank. S. C. Carson made motion that the money be changed and Frank Abercrombia 2nd the motion. Bill Wallace made an admentment that Mr. Perry check with the banks and see which is the best and how much service charge they make. After a round table discussion it was agreed upon by all for Mr. Perry to look into this and put the money in the bank that would be most profitable to us.

C. F. James made a motion for W. A. Gaines to put up 10 minute parking signs from intersection of Main and Werner Street back 6 parking spaces to take care of parking at the Post Office and also put up signs of no double parking from Phillips Caf@ to the intersection. Frank Abercrombia 2nd this motion and an ordinance was made to this effect. The parking was also discussed next to the railroad. The couãil and Mr. Gaines are going to figure out the best thing to be done with t at.
