MINUTES

At the regular monthly meeting June 4, 1956 at 4 P. M. the following were present: Mayor S. C. Carson, Councilmen Earle Crane, Grady Berry, Doyle Elrod, C. B. Bryan and G. T. Newton.

The Mayor called the meeting to order and the minutes of the last meeting were read. Doyle Elrod made a motion that the minutes be adopted, C. B. Bryan 2nd this motion.

Mayor Carson reported to the Council that sidewalks in the Town had been fixed. He also reported that he had appealed to the Fire Department and the Wesleyan College to work out something definite on a fire charge to be made to the College for using our equipment. After a lengthy discussion the Council agreed that the fire truck would not leave town until a written agreement was signed by the Town and College officials.

The firmen expressed their appreciated of the Town Officials for helping them to join the S. C. Firmen's Association.


A discussion of the flag was carried on but nothing definite has been done about this.

A round table discussion on street lights followed. Earle Crane made a motion that new street lights be installed at the upper end of Gaines Street between Bown and Holcombe residence; and one at Margaret Seaborn. This motion was 2nd by C. B. Bryan and the Council voted unanimously.

Taxes were discussed. The Council gave Mrs. James permission to mark off Roy Dillard 1956 taxes, also C. C. Phillips personal tax, \$2.50 street tax on W. W. Allen (too Old) that he paid last year to come off this year's tax payment and R. E. Holcombe's to be marked down \$14.25 that he paid on his car in 1955 when he was not in town.


