MINUTES

The council held their regular monthly meeting at the Town Office May 6, 1957 at 7 P. M. with Mayor S. C. Carson, Councilmen F. E. Young, C. B. Bryan, J. G., J. Cleo Bolding and J. J. Canup present. The Mayor had invited Col. Ralph Sears to talk with the Council on our telephone problem.

The meeting was called to order and the April minutes were read. C. B. Bryan made a motion that the minutes be adopted, a 2nd was made by F. E. Young and the Council voted unanimously.

A discussion on a clean up week for Central followed. Mr. Bolding who was chairman for the C. of C. clean up said that nothing had been accomplished so the Town Decided to sponsor a clean up from May 13 through May 31.

Water and sewer to the housing project was the next subject Water lines have been extended to cover these houses and the Commission will receive \$480.00 to cover cost. The sewer is our main problem. \$1200 for sewer is all we can be reimbursed and it will cost us considerable more, but the Authority has promised to pay \$1.00 per tenant sewer charge which will amount to \$24 per month. In a year we should have all expenses repaid on these lines.

Financial statements of the Town and Commission were given to each member of the Council, copies which are attached herewith. Also a budget with estimated expenditure and expenses. If our 57 mills are retained we will have approximately enough money to meet our expenses. After some discussion C. B. Bryan made a motion that we adopt an ordinance calling for 57 mills, F. E. Young 2nd this motion and the council voted unanimously.

The ejector station at Woodson's will cost at least \$3500 or \$4000. A septic tank would be cheaper but the state will not permit us to construct another tank. We will go ahead and do this work and keep all bills itemized and try to get Federal Aid. The ejector station pump will be here in two weeks.

The subject of loose dogs was brought up. At the Municipal meeting which was held in Liberty a discussion on a County wide program to let the Rabies Control Officer be in different towns at certain times was talked. The meeting will be held here in May so we will get information on this at that time.

The piccolo in the cafes are turned up so loud that it bothers everyone. Mr. Lawrence will be instructed to see the proprietor and if these are not tuned down the Council are going to have them removed.

Col. Sears talked with the Council about our telephone system.

The meeting then adjourned.
