The Town Council held their regular meeting June 6, 1960. with all members present.

Mr. Bryan made a motion that anyone wanting extra cutting done with the Town tractor & Mower pay a minimum of \$4.00 per hr. The Council agreed.

Mr. Golden and Mr. Moser gave a report on the water system. Mr. Golden said he thought a bigger pump as needed in order to pump the amount of water needed. No action was taken on this.

The Council agreed to add \$50.00 to Mr. Moser & Mr. Golden's pay check the week they are to be on vacation and let them decide whether or not any assistance would be needed.

The garbage pick up was brought up. The Council talked with Mr. Gaines about this He said that he would talk to his help about improving the pick up.

The Council agreed to keep Aron Collins for another month in order to get all trash hauled.

~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~ A discussion was also held on not making any adjustments beyond the water meter. The Council agreed that all water that went through the meter should be paid for and no adjustments made. Mr. Young made a motion that a rubber stamp be bought to stamp no adjustments will be made ~~on anything that~~ happens beyond the meter. Mr. Bolding second the motion. The Council agreed.

Mr. Carson read a letter from Winn Dixie saying their lease would soon be up. He also read a letter from Mr. Reese asking that a representative from the Town Council be appointed for the Coordinating Council of the Town. Mr. Bolding appointed Mr. Carson to be a representative. The Council agreed.

The Council also had a discussion on stray dogs running around and had not been inoculated. Mr. Bolding made a motion that every dog should display a tag showing that it had been inoculated, and if not they would be picked up and carried to Pickens and held there for three days and if not picked up by the owner they would then be destroyed. Mr. Bryan second the motion. The Council voted unanously.

The question of teen agers playing pin ball machines was brought up by Mr. Young made a motion that no one under 21 yrs. of age be allowed to play a pin ball machine, and the machine show a sign that no minors allowed to play.

Mr. Carson mentioned that side walks were needed from the Depot to the Under Pass and from Hunter's Barber Shop to the ~~Bridge~~ ^{Near Mill} ~~Bridge~~ ^{didge}. Mr. Duncan made a motion that the walks be fixed. Mr. Young second the motion. The Council agreed.
