Mayor Cumbie called the meeting to order.
Invocation by "Doc" Evatt.
Minutes of the May 14, 1990 meeting were read. Motion by Stan Thompson, seconded by Frank Chaka to accept as read.
Vote unanimous.

OLD BUSINESS::

Stan Thompson: Public Safety - Discussion only of court procedures. Noted that Dover case was back in the courts.

Frank Chaka: Finance - Reviewed financial report. Several items taken care of since they are payable once a year. After review, Mr. Chaka gave a favorable report.

Troy Porter: Recreation - Reviewed recreation budget.

Clarence Phillips: Water & Sewer - no report.

Harry Holladay: Discussion of recycling. Mayor Cumbie noted that King's Recycling in Easley would accept any and all items that are recyclable.

"Doc" Evatt: Street & Sanitation - Noted concern that Hwy. 93 widening would be in conjunction with Central's best interest concerning beautification. Mayor Cumbie advised that the Planning Commission was working with the beautification program and council would discuss at next work session.

NEW BUSINESS:

Stan Thompson: Public Safety - None.

Frank Chaka: Finance - Discussion of complaints concerning burned house on Church St. It was noted that the sight was being cleared.

Troy Porter: Recreation - None.

Clarence Phillips:- Water & Sewer - None.

Harry Holladay: Planning - None.

"Doc" Evatt: Street & Sanitation - None.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT:

Mr. Herbert Thompson discussed the need for replacing bearings in two gear boxes at South Treatment Plant. This at a cost of approximately \$2500 each and subsequent ones to be replaced as needed. Motion by Clarence Phillips, seconded by Troy Porter to replace the bearings. Vote was unanimous.

18 Mile Creek Project: Funding for possible development was discussed. Need more information from committee before any decision could be made.

MAYOR'S REPORT:

Books open June 12, 1990 for the September election of a mayor and three councilpersons. Discussion only of a local option sales tax issue. James Teal's resignation from the Planning Commission was reluctantly accepted. Mayor Cumbie presented the plat of the new section of Mt. Zion Cemetery which is now ready for sale. There are 664 grave spaces available in the new section.

After discussion as to making the new part perpetual care, which would be flat markers only, no coping or gravel, motion was made by Clarence Phillips and seconded by Frank Chaka, to have the town attorney draw up the legal documents with proper stipulations to this effect. After discussion the vote was unanimous. Motion by Frank Chaka, seconded by Troy Porter to set the selling price at \$300 per grave space, no inside and outside difference in price since it would be perpetual care. Vote was unanimous.


