MINUTES

At the regular monthly meeting of the Town Council held Monday July 9 at 7 P. M. the following were present: S. C. Carson, Mayor, G. T. Newton, Earle Crane, H. R. Holliday, Grady Berry and C. B. Bryan. Visitors in the meeting were Col. Sears and Mr. Cranford of the American Legion.

The Mayor called the meeting to order and the minutes of the last meeting were read. Mr. Holliday asked that the minutes concerning the fire truck going to the College be read again. Mr. Carson explained what happened at the last meeting and Earle Crane made a motion that the minutes be adopted. The 2nd was made by Grady Berry and the Council voted unanimously.

Another discussion on the fire truck going to the college was carried on. After several consideration the Council agreed for the Mayor to meet with the fire department and the college to set up a fee and agreement.

Mrs. James will notify Mr. Chapman again about the street lights at Seehorn's and Holcombe.

A \$50 assessment on Edna Dobsen for a lot that is out of Town and Harold Arnold, and John H. King Street Tax will be marked off the tax books. This motion was made by C. B. Bryan and 2nd by H. R. Holliday. Mr. Carson also reported that all taxes must be paid before ordering tags in October - you will be liable to the State Highway Dept. Taxes collected as of July was \$23,284.96.

After some discussion on principal, interest due for the next tax year H. R. Holliday moved that we transfer from Easley Bank to the Port Hill (Bond Interest Account) \$17,600.00 which will take care of all interest and principal due on bonds and notes up until June, 1957. This motion was 2nd by C. B. Bryan and the Council voted unanimously. Mr. Carson was asked to investigate putting some of this money in savings to draw interest.

Visitor were recognized and welcomed. Mr. Cranford was the speaker for the American Legion and he wanted to know about the street dancing and came to work something out with the Council. After a lengthy discussion H. R. Holliday made a motion to table this and have a referendum to be held at the next town election and let the people vote whether they want street dancing or not. A 2nd for this motion was made by G. T. Newton. Those in favor G. T. Newton, H. R. Holliday and C. B. Bryan, Against Grady Berry and Earle Crane. The majority ruled.

H. R. Holliday made a motion that the meeting adjourn, C. B. Bryan made the 2nd.
