A regular meeting of the Town Council was held on July 20, 1971 with the following attending: Mayor H. R. Holladay, Councilmen Herbert Thompson, Jr., Glen D. O'Dell, J. R. Herd, A. B. Cumbie, Jr., and George Fowler. Also present for the meeting were Mr. J. L. Brock, Dot Yandle from the Messenger, and also a representative from the Greenville News.

Mayor Holladay read a letter to the Council from the Office of the Governor concerning a Reconnaissance Survey for the Town of Central, S. C. Mr. Blenn Fore asked to meet with us on August 5, 1971 at 2:00 p.m. to discuss this Survey for the Town. This seemed to be an agreeable date with the Council.

Mr. J. L. Brock was present for the meeting. He made a request for 420 feet of sewer line to be used at the new Methodist Church parsonage in the Kel-Car Acres. There was some discussion on this request and it was decided to table this until later on in the meeting.

It was reported to the Council that Mr. Zimmerman from Greenville was interested in developing a Trailer Park on about 8½ acres of land out Pratt-Read Road if the Town needed this or if enough people want this. Some discussion was held on this matter, and it was decided to contact said party and let them know that we are favorable of this development.

It was reported that a new Rural Fire Truck had been purchased the cost being approximately \$8,400.00.

It was also reported to the Council that the Police Car Repairs would be around \$700.00, but due to the car being under warranty the Town would only have to pay a small amount of this \$700.00.

A bill was presented to the Council for the use of personal cars for Police Work while the Police car was in the shop. Harold McKern with 1,605 miles and Harold Duncan with 154 miles. After discussion, Councilman O'Dell made a motion, seconded by Councilman Cumbie to pay \$.08 per mile for the use of these cars. This vote was unanimous.

Councilman O'Dell made a motion, seconded by Councilman Kennemore, that John Head be given the authority to drive the Water Works Truck home every night in the case of emergency calls after working hours. This vote was unanimous.

Councilman Fowler made a motion, seconded by Councilman O'Dell, to adopt the Maintenance Agreement on the 3-M Copier for an annual fee of \$50.00. This vote was unanimous.

An executive session of the Council Meeting was called.

### Minutes of Executive Session:

It was reported that there were approximately twenty (20) people to obtain rights of way from for the sewerage lines. Also it was reported that in mid-September bids to be let on the Sewer and that John would be required to spend considerable time with this and that he would need additional help.

There was some discussion on the bonding and or insurance of policemen to protect the Town against lawsuits. It was suggested that the Mayor talk to the Town Attorney for advice on this.

There was some discussion on the annexation of the area west of Town including Duke Power and Pratt Road to be investigated. It was suggested that Leland Brock and Mayor H. R. Holladay to contact interested people.


Leland Brock's request for 420 feet of sewer line to serve the new Methodist Church Parsonage that was discussed, the Town declined to lay this line after due consideration.
