

Regular Meeting  
Aug. 11, 1980  
Council Meeting

Those present: Councilman Porter, Chaka, Thompson, Evatt, Boyles, Mayor Holladay, Administrator Jones, Clerk & Treas. Hughes, Chief of Police Cantrell. Candidate's running for the Sept. Election, James R. Longo, Jimmy Evatt, Carl Rampey & Olin Gambrell III. Gady Ireland Fort Hill Cable T.V. was present and stated that most of the cable lines were installed in Central and asked council to consider adopting a resolution to transfer from Tar River Co. to Daniel Properties. Mr. Ireland stated this did not effect the franchise whatsoever just a change in the owner.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved as read. *Christy Ireland Attorney for News Service, Messy & P. Dickerson*

Police report presented by Chief Cantrell for the month of July.

Financial Report was presented to Council for the month of July & noted that 93% of income had been received for our fiscal year.

Administrator Barney Jones presented a chart to the council showing operation cost for water & sewer departments. The showing of this chart indicated cost above actual income.

Hearing on Revenue Sharing was held this date Aug 10, 80 and no one present for this meeting.

Motion by Chaka, seconded by Thompson to accept recommendation from the Central Planning Commission on rezoning of Kingwood Sub-Divison from R-12 to GR motion carried.

Discussion on Up Country Carolina Association Membership was discussed and council decided not to join membership.

Motion by Thomspson, seconded by Evatt to delete the Sat. morning office hours from 8:30 to 12. Council approved without opposition.

Albert McDonald, water customer located on Woodlawn Circle received a water bill for \$66.00 in which he stated no leaks and gone for the 2 weeks in July and felt this was unjust and ask council to consider an adjustment. Motion by Porter seconded by Chaka to average last 3 months bills and adjust. Council approved without opposition.

Thompson suggested that a larger line be installed at Woodlawn Circle as soon as possible.

Tommy Ellison, owner of Central Car Wash ask the council to consider an adjustment on sewer charge for his business. The committee that was appointed by mayor Holladay to study this same problem on the Speed Wash owned by L.O. Evatt was asked by council to study this matter and report back to the council at the next regular council meeting.

Motion by Chaka, seconded by Thompson to adopt policy for supervisor in charge of the prisorner's to pay for their meals. Council passed without opposition.

Motion by Thompson seconded by Chaka to adopt this resolution. Council approved without opposition.

Request was denied to Mr. John Hampton for water & sewer to be run to his property on Patterson Rd. at the town's expense. Council felt that we should stay with the policy own this service. Council asked that Mr. Jones talk with Mr. Hampton and give a report at the next regular council meeting.

Motion by Thomspson seconded by Chaka to appoint Mrs. E.L. <sup>Bolick</sup> for the election commission for a term of 4 years in which would expire Sept. 1984, Mrs Clyde Lawrence for a term to expire Sept. 1986 & Mrs. Catherine Carson term to expire ~~XXXX~~ Sept. 1980. Council approved without opposition.

Motion by Thomspson seconded by Chaka to purchase firemen's uniform for the additional 6 firemen that had joined the Fire Dept. Council approved without opposition.

Request of running the sewer line across private property belonging to Mr. J.A. Head to benefit service to one of the houses located on Watkins St. at the town's expense was denied. Council said to stay with the town policy..

The light post behind the post office on the ball field was again in discussion and council ask Mr. Jones to check with Buddy Sims and give a report at the next regular meeting.

Mayor Holladay noted council that the Old Elementary School was being put up for bids by the Pickens County School District.

There being no further business the meeting of Aug. 11, 1980 adjourned.
