The Town Council met Thursday night, September 2, 1965, with the following attending: Mayor W.C. Kelley, Councilmen Glenn D. O'Dell, J.R. Herd, J.I. Martin, W.J. Wilson, Jerry Lesley, R.A. Busha. Mrs. Maude Chapman, representing the Messenger paper was also present.

Mayor Kelley presided over the meeting. The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

A discussion was held on repairing the old jail to house prisoners rather than carry them to pickens. The Town Council agreed to have plumbing repaired, install heat and paint the inside of the jail.

Mayor Kelley stated that work would soon begin on the sidewalk on Church Street and that repairs on Ramseur and Berry Streets would soon be completed.

The Town Council agreed to give Chief Harold Duncan One Hundred Dollars for the purchase of uniforms per year also to order decals for the police car. The Council stated that they would like for Chief Duncan to help with school boy patrols and agreed to give full cooperation in helping outfit the patrols in proper uniforms.

Councilman Martin announced that the Fire Dept. was in need of new hose for the Fire truck. Council discussed this matter but decided to wait until next meeting to make a decision.

Making a one-way street out of the street leading from Cannon Memorial Church by the Central Elementary School to Church Street was decided upon. The Council also agreed to have chief Duncan to check with the Highway Dept. on rules governing the stop light at the ~~intersection~~ intersection of Church & Main streets. It was decided to prohibit right turns on red light until information is received.

Being no further business the meeting adjourned.
