September 6, 1959

The Town Council held their regular meeting September 6, 1959, with the following members present: Mayor, S.C. Carson, Councilmen, J. Cleo Bolding, J.A. Dyar, C.B. Bryan, D.R. Duncan.

The Meeting was called to order by Mayor Carson.

Mr. Bolick gave some interesting information about the Central Easley Water District. Dr. Burns and some of the staff members of the Wesleyan College were present and discussed this matter with Mr. Bolick, the Councilmen and Mayor Carson.

Discussions were held on the feasibility of taking the Wesleyan Methodist College into the City limits. No action was taken.

Mr. Duncan made the motion that we accept the petition of property owners on the West side of town, who would like to come into town limits. Mr. Bryan seconded the motion. The Council voted favorable.

The resignation of Mr. McAlister as water Superintendant was accepted. Mr. Duncan made the motion that Mr. McAlister be replaced by Mr. Roy Golden, at the rate of \$60.00 per month. The Council also voted favorable to hire Mr. Milton Moser to assist Mr. Golden, \$50.00 per week.

Mr. Bryan made the motion that the water works employees be paid Friday afternoon instead of Thursday afternoon. The Council agreed. Mr. Bolding made the motion that the base rate of water be raised to the old rate of \$2.40 in city limits and \$3.00 outside city limits. Industrial & Wesleyan College to remain the same. Mr. Bryan seconded the motion. The council voted favorable.

Mr. Bolding made the motion that the Council go along with Duke Power Co. alterations, plan no. 1, which included six twenty thousand mercury lights, and four seven thousand mercury lights on Gaines St. In the business district, thirteen seven thousand lights on remainder of Main St. from Mt. Zion colored Church to Wesleyan Dr. Amount to be an increase of \$63.30 per month. The Council voted favorable.

The Council agreed to charge Mr. Earle \$5.68 per month for rent, beginning the 1st of September, 1959, plus all long distance calls.

Being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
