At a special meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Central, South Carolina, held in the Town Clerk Office Friday evening September 30th, 1946. there were present: Mayor J.R. Rowland, Councilmen, J.A. Mauldin, R.C. Herd and T.A. Phillips - H.S. Rampey, Oscar Wilson and R.L. Bowen absent. The fact that H.S. Rampey and Oscar Wilson had recently moved out of the incorporate limits of the Town and wer'nt, for this reason, eligible to take part in the proceedings only in a social way, accounts for their absence; whereas R.L. Bowen, doubtless, failed to receive notification.

A brief session of the old Council ensued after which the new one took charge.

The purpose of the meeting in part being the canvassing of returns and declaration of results of the Towns R^{egular} Election held September 24th 1946, they the Council immediately set to work.

On motion made by J.A. Mauldin that the results of said election as tabulated by the Box Managers be accepted, Council readily agreed; Said result being as follows:

J.R. Rowland re-elected as Mayor. J.A. Mauldin, R.C. Herd and T.A. Phillips re-elected to Council. Also Joe Gaines, Bill Mc Alister and Chas Thomas were elected as Councilmen.

After taking the oath of office Mayor Rowland proceeded to give same to the Council Members as a group. Along with these Hovey Seaborn as a member of the Commn of Public Works took the oath of office.

This done, A.W. Rochester re-elected, or rather, appointed Clerk and Treasurer.

W.A. Campbell appointed Chief of Police; who took the oath of office along with the Clerk.

At the close, after which adjournment came, Joe Gains app'd Mayor

At the regular monthly meeting of the Town Council held in the Clerks Office Monday evening March 3rd 1947 there were all the Council members in attendance other than J.A.Mauldin who was absent on account of sickness. Said Council at this meeting authorized and instructed its Clerk, A.W.Rochester, to withdraw the arrest warrant charges made Vs Messrs Wilton Earle and Joe Bill Vickery in said warrant dated Jan 2nd., 1947 and return check of J.D.Vickery for \$200.00 being held as Bond.

At this same meeting Council passed a resolution making \$12.00 the minimum fine to be collected from those violating the Town's Ordinances.
