Those Present: Mayor H.R. Holladay, Councilmen: Hopkins, Thompson, Fowler, Porter, Police Chief Duncan, Citizen of Town: Al Cumbie Jr., Mr. L.S. Griffin, Mr. & Mrs. Brock, Mr. & Mrs. Werner, Mrs. Allen, Bob Nash, Rev. Waddell & others. Also House of Representative Ed Simpson.

Mayor Holladay called the meeting to order and asked Rev. Waddell, pastor of Mr. Zion Methodist Church to give the invocation.

The mayor recognized Mr. Ed Simpson and thanked him for coming to the meeting and explaining the Home Rule Bill pertaining to (County Government.) Mr. Simpson stated that this rule would go through 1982 in which it could be amended at this election time.

He explained the 5 types of government for the county which were:

1) Council--responsible to County) Delegation responsible to State.  
2) Supervisor, 3) Administrator, 4) Manager, 5) Commissioner all these types will be on ballot at the election in Dec.? 1975.

Mr. Simpson stated their will be a meeting Nov. 11, at Daniel High School for the purpose of explaining the Home Rule to other citizens.

Councilmen Fowler suggested that a letter be mailed to those who aren't connected to our sewer lines approximately (20) persons.

Request for St lights at Leland Brock place, St. Committee Porter & Kennemore was asked to look into this matter.

Request for windows at the Old School Building to be covered as soon as possible. This had already been approved early. Porter, Leland Brock & Bob Nash was asked to work together on this matter.

Mayor brought before the council the matter concerning the Central Planning Commission that some of the members term had expired. These were Mr. L. S. Griffin & Mr. S.C. Carson who the mayor reappointed to serve on staggered terms. Letters were mailed to each member of the Planning Commission. SEE ATTACHED COPY Council approved. Motion by Porter 2nd by Fowler.

Ramsey Rollins had approached the mayor for a building to be erected in the R-6 zoning for equipment and possible a Real Estate Office where no business are to be established. Council suggest that a letter be written to Mr. Rollins to go before the Planning Commission requesting rezoning.

Request for annexation into the city limits by Carl James. Motion by Fowler, 2nd by Hopkins to bring Carl James inside. Council approved. (Need a drawing of plat.)

Request from Clarence Freeman for refund of partial payment of sewer tap. Council recommended refund of full amount of \$150.

Request from John for William Alexander to paint the street markers @ \$2.50 per hour. Motion by Porter, 2nd by Thompson Council approved.

Mayor stated that street marker had been purchased for purpose of marking off street.

Question of peddlers, mobile sale units, etc. should not park in front of merchants stores. Motion by Fowler, 2nd by Hopkins to park at the old Depot for any length of time and through residential areas at anytime.

Porter stated that Swinford was going out of business and would donate carpet totown meeting room and would give lessons (karate) to police officers one night a week. No action was taken.

Executive meeting called as of October 12, 1975.

Overtime was discussed at this meeting and approved no more overtime pay. Four (4) of the regular employees were reviewed concerning increase in salary and approved. They were: Chief Duncan, Catherine Hughes, Jimmy Head, and John Head.
