October 12, 1982  
Regular Council Meeting

The Clerk swore in the three councilmen that were successful in the September 28 Election. (Mr. Chaka, Mr. Evatt, Mr. Porter)

Present: Mayor Summey, Mr. Chaka, Mr. Evatt, Mr. Gambrell, Mr. Porter, Mr. Rampey

Reading of the Minutes of the September 13 Regular Council Meeting. Motion by Chaka; second by Gambrell to approve. Vote unanimous.

Council Reports

Mr. Porter had no report on Development.

Mr. Chaka had no report.

Mr. Gambrell presented the Financial Report.

Mr. Rampey presented the Police Report. Mentioned dog problem on Mills Avenue and Aiken Street. He also mentioned several trees that were close to the road in Cedar Creek and a tree that blocked a streetlight on Coker Circle.

Mr. Evatt--No report on recreation. He did note a potential problem concerning the place where the water line had been laid on Gaines Street.

Mr. Chaka noted that we had a problem with many street signs being unreadable. Administrator noted that 25 green reflector posts had been ordered from the County.

Mr. Porter presented a proposal from Mr. Folger concerning replacing a sidewalk in front of his house. He said that he would pay for the concrete if the city would pay for the labor to form and finish. Mr. Porter noted that the cost to the Town would be 250.00. Motion by Porter; second by Gambrell to approve. Vote unanimous.

Administrator's Report

Administrator noted the need for a holiday between January 1 and July 4. No action taken.

Administrator presented a situation involving the line that Mr. Reid and others ~~are~~ installing. Mr. Chisman stated that he would install a loop from the new line to the existing line in Nord-Lac. Eilers pointed out that there would be minimal benefit to the city.

Mr. Chisman was asking that the city lift its limit of 20 taps on the old line; and allow DHEC to set the maximum number of taps on the old line.

Motion by Porter; second by Chaka to approve. Mr. Evatt opposed. (Vote 5-1)

Old Business

Annexation of Portion of Vickery Drive, <sup>0<sup>th</sup></sup> Motion by Chaka; second by Porter to approve. Vote unanimous.

Annexation of portion of land belonging to Sidden; Earle. Motion by Chaka; second by Rampey to approve. Vote unanimous.

Annexation of Regency Apartments as of Feb. 1, 1983. Motion by Chaka; second by Gambrell to approve. Vote unanimous.

## New Business

Administrator presented a request to change Halloween from Sunday to Saturday night. Motion by Gambrell; second by Evatt to approve. Vote unanimous.

1. Purchase of Southern Bell building behind city hall. Mayor and administrator were asked to explore grants and multi-year financing concerning purchase.
2. Agreement with Easley-Central concerning water breaks. Administrator presented proposed agreement (See copy). Motion by Chaka; second by Gambrell to approve. Vote unanimous.
3. Purchase of Police Vehicle. Administrator asked permission to bid out vehicle. Council asked that at least three bids be obtained.
4. Administrator addressed question of using county labor to read water meters. He stated that if there was a problem that the use would cease. Council felt that it was bad public relations. Administrator assured Council that the practice would stop.

## Mayor's Report

Mayor noted that he was designating October 24 as United Nations Day. Motion by Gambrell; second by Rampey to approve. Vote unanimous.
