November 7, 1963

The Town Council met Thursday night, November 7, 1963, with the following attending: Mayor J.A. Cranford, Councilmen C.B. Bryan, J.L. Martin, R.A. Busha, H.M. Brooks, W.J. Wilson, and Mrs. Maude Chapman representing the Messenger Paper.

A discussion was held on Paul Porter's horse, which fell in a manhole on Main Street in the Town of Central. No action was taken on this at this time, but the Councilmen did decide to let John Gentry, Town Lawyer, make this decision as to payment of hospitalization for the animal and treatment.

Mr. Cranford stated that the Filterplant had been closed and was no longer in use and that Mr. Gibson had asked about buying the Chlorinator from the Town. No decision was made on this. The Council decided to meet on Monday at 5:30 P.M. and check equipment at the Filterplant.

Mr. Brooks mentioned that Mrs. Harvey Williams and Mrs. Charles James had requested that a street light be installed on a lot belonging to him between the two houses where many whiskey bottles have been found in the past few weeks. The Town Council decided that the Policeman should watch this area very close and make a decision at the next meeting as to where a light should be installed or not.

A discussion was held on the sewer problem on the West end of town. Mr. Martin stated that the problem was due to the fact that the line was probably installed with too much fall.

The Council discussed each Business Place in town as having bins at the back of each store to put the garbage in, and that this would solve the problem for the men picking up garbage.

The Council agreed to have the telephone disconnected at the Filterplant.


A discussion was held on building a new Town Hall. Mr. Wilson said that he would check with Mr. Henry Gaines about plans for a building and Mr. Cranford said that he would check with his brother-in-law also about plans.

Mr. Bryan made a motion that the Town borrow \$1,000.00, from Carolina National Bank until January, 1964, rather than take money out of the Savings Account. Mr. Wilson seconded the motion. The Council agreed.

Being no further business the meeting adjourned.
