Mayor Cumbie called the meeting to order.

Invocation by Harry Holladay.

Minutes of the November 11, 1985 meeting were read. Motion by Frank Chaka, second by Troy Porter to adopt. Vote unanimous.

OLD BUSINESS:

Mr. Chaka---Gave police report

Mr. Porter---Noted the sidewalk on Gassaway Street was in bad shape, not only in front of Mr. Cleo Hendricks house. Need to replace all the way when feasible.

Mr. Phillips--None

Mr. Holladay---Noted the Booster Club banquet was well attended and trophies given to each player.

Mr. Gambrell gave the financial report. Mr. Porter made a motion, seconded by Mr. Chaka to instruct restaurants not to go beyond the \$3.50 maximum for the county workers and their supervisor for meals, also to list each ticket by items consumed (If a meal comes below this amount list it on ticket, if it goes beyond the person is to take care of the difference). Vote unanimous.

NEW BUSINESS:

Mr. Camden Eflin request for water line on Pike Road was discussed. This being a 750' line. Mr. Eflin wished to be allowed to run the line at his expense and be able to charge taps from neighbors to recoup his expense. Motion by Frank Chaka second by Harry Holladay to allow this. After discussion the vote was taken, 3 for and 2 against (Mayor, Chaka, Phillips for) (Porter and Holladay against) After this Mr. Porter made a motion second by Mr. Phillips not to allow Mr. Eflin to recoup any expenses (noting that he should contact people between the main line and his house before he thinks of line installation)

Vote 4 for 1 against (Mayor objected)

Motion by Frank Chaka to rescind his first motion, second by Clarence Phillips, vote unanimous.

RAYMOND TAYLOR recognized. To come back to next work session with particulars concerning water taps and meters at his trailer park.

MAYOR'S REPORT--Discussion of C. D. B. G. Grant application for Head Town area, this being the most competitive project available for this grant based on Public Hearing December 5, 1985. Motion by Mayor Cumbie second by Frank Chaka to apply for this grant. After much discussion of pros and cons the vote was 3 against 2 for. Mr. Phillips and Mr. Porter stated their objection was based on the fact that the Town would have to come up with 10% matching funds.

NEW BUSINESS:

Motion by Harry Holladay second by Troy Porter to contact S. C. Wildlife Commission and all others necessary concerning health hazard beavers are presenting to citizens of Central.

1. Have them come get rid of beavers or give Town of Central permission to dispose of them as we see fit.

Vote was unanimous.

Frank Chaka--Discussed Fire, Police and Rescue plans to buy VCR with funds from their own projects. This for training purposes etc.

Troy Porter--Discussion of new dump truck. Mr. Gambrell, Mr. Porter and Earl Galbreath to get specs, cost, etc. and bring back to next work session.

Motion by Troy Porter, second by Frank Chaka to adopt changes in Sanitation Department Policy (copy attached). Vote unanimous.

Mr. Phillips--None
