SPECIAL MEETING TOWN COUNCIL June 26, 1973

Those Present: O'Dell, Thompson, Fowler, Hopkins, Chief Duncan,

The matter of a Mrs. Frances Hill's complaint about paying taxes on property that is not actually in town limits was brought before council. It was clear that Mrs. Hill had paid taxes that were not due and we therefore should refund her the 1972 taxes in the amount of \$25.50. (previously Ramey property.).

Dr. O'Dell presented the cost of fidelity bond for the Mayor, and Clerks. \$5.00 per \$1,000 insurance. Mr. Fowler made the motion that the clerk and Mayor be bonded for \$10,000 each and the policemen \$1,000 each. Dr. O'Dell seconded the motion.

Dr. O'Dell mentioned the the council the problems we are having with the 88 Water Co. as far as their responsibility and ours. It was the council's opinion that we should have a meeting with the highway 88 officials and straighten the problems out.

* Mrs. Williams mentioned that the people who requested that the lot next to E. Hunter's house across from Pratt Reed Rd. were presuming that they were going to be in town limits. They have inquired to the Town Hall about putting a trailer on the lot and the cost of tap ons. The council agreed that they be brought into the limits under the conditions previously sent to them in the letter regarding the cost of the pipes, etc. Mr. Fowler made the motion they be brought in the limits, seconded by Mr. O'Dell. *See Letter Dated May 16, 1973, Also Council minutes of April 19, 1973 & MAY 15, 1973*

Mr. O'Dell mentioned to the council that the computer situation should be ready to take over our water billings by Aug. 1, 1973.

The mayor then read a letter regarding the fuel oil situation and expressed to the council that we were in good shape.

Chief Duncan gave a brief report to the council regarding Mr. Cannon. He said Cannon had agreed to stay and the shifts would be rearranged so that we could make it with 3 policemen for a while.
