MINUTES

CALLED COUNCIL MEETING

Those present: Mayor Holladay, Furman Hopkins, Phyllis Boyles, Jay Rollins, Herbert Thompson.

The meeting of July 20, 1978 was called to order by Mayor Holladay:

Robert Newton was present and he made a request to the Town to take over the Heatherwood Sub-division Sewer System. Newton stated he would pay all cost for engineering fees, right of ways, lift station and make necessary repairs of all sewer lines in the present system so the present lines would be free of any inflow waters from outside of the system., and would arrange a system with East Clemson Water District so that we could collect a sewer fee which would be 100% of the water bill. He further stated that there are approximately 82 apartments, 24 homes in East Briar and approximately 40 homes in Heatherwood. The Mayor stated we would do a further study on this matter and clear up all legal angles so this venture would not cost the Town of Central any money and report back to council and to Mr. Newton.

Herbert Thompson presented the name of Thad Garrick to council to become the Waste Treatment Plant Superintendent and Laboratory Superintendent, also be responsible for the sewer lines inside and outside of the town. Mr. Garrick has a C license now and he stated he will get his B license in the near future. Thompson recommended a salary of \$13,300 a year to start or \$255.77 a week. When Mr. Garrick gets his B waste water license he would be raised to \$14,000 a year or \$269.23 a week. Thompson made a motion to hire Mr. Garrick as our waste treatment plant superintendent and Laboratory superintendent to do all waste water test in our laboratory, maintain accurate records of plant performance and fill out the E.P.A. monitoring report and mail to proper authorities, be responsible for all maintenance of our plants and sewerage lines inside and outside of town at a starting salary of \$13,300 per year or \$255.77 a week and as soon as Mr. Garrick gets his B waste water license raise him to \$14,000 a year or \$269.23 a week. Jay Rollins seconded the motion. All council members present voted unanimously to hire Mr. Garrick as our Waste Treatment Plant Superintendent and Laboratory Superintendent.

Mayor Holladay made a request to hire Mecal Stewart to serve as a back up man for our waste water treatment plants and part time helper for water lines and street repair. Mecal stated to Thompson that he had a C license in waste water and after much discussion it was stated that Stewart Von Tungeln would be going back to school in the near future and we will need another man. Hopkins made a motion to hire Mecal Stewart to work part time on our waste water plants and part time on water and street repairs at a starting salary of \$170.00 per week and Rollins seconded the motion and council voted to hire Mecal Stewart.

Mayor Holladay recommended Barney Jones to council and recommended that he be hired as the Town Administrator, after Mr. Jones made a statement Mr. Jones asked if anyone had any questions. Then the Mayor excused Mr. Jones from the meeting. Mr. Holladay stated Mr. Jones was once employed by Central Wesleyan College as the Administrator. Then after further discussion Furman Hopkins made a motion to hire MR. Jones as our administrator at a starting salary of \$210.00 a week. Mrs. Boyles seconded the motion. The mayor and coucil members present voted in favor to hire Mr. Jones as our administrator.

There being no further business the meeting of July 20, 1978 adjourned.
