A Special Call Meeting of the Town Council was held on Monday, May 31, 1971 at 7:00 P. M. with the following attending: Mayor, H. R. Holladay, Councilmen Herbert Thompson, Jr., J. R. Herd, George Fowler, Glen D. O'Dell, and Jack Kennemore. Also present for the meeting was Mr. Jim Beeson, Engineer.

Mr. Jim Beeson met with the Council to discuss the Walker Holliday-Highway 88 Proposed Water District, of which a survey had been made some two years ago. He reported to the Council that there were some 200 to 250 residents wanting to tap on to a City Water System. Their proposal is to tie on to the water lines at 18 Mile Creek and go to Highway 88, and branching out both ways into Anderson County. The cost of said water line would be from \$200,000.00 to \$210,000.00 from which a loan would have to be made by the Farmer's Home Administration and the residents tapping on to the water would repay this amount over a period of 40 years. Said residents are requesting the Town of Central to supply the water and to maintain the lines and etc. After discussion, a motion was made by Councilman O'Dell and seconded by Councilman Fowler, that the Town of Central go on record as being receptive to the Highway 88 Water District with the understanding that there will be no initial expense to the Town of Central in listing subscribers, laying pipe, surveying, or in any other form. Once the loan is approved, fees and costs that are mutual agreeable to the Town and to the District will be worked out. The vote was four for with one abstaining.

A Dog Ordinance drawn up by W. G. Acker, Town Attorney, was read by the Mayor. After the reading of the Ordinance, Councilman Fowler made a motion, seconded by Councilman Kennemore to adopt the Ordinance to be enacted on July 10, 1971. It was also voted to have this Ordinance printed in the Messenger and also a copy mailed out with each water bill the first of July, 1971. This vote was unanimously carried.

It was voted unanimous to send two delegates and their wives to the Firemen's Convention to be held in Greenville, S. C. on June 6 - 8, 1971.

It was also the action of the Town Council to have street lights erected at the intersection of Pine Loop Circle and Johnston Road near the residence of Stanley Thompson, and also at the intersection of Pine Loop Circle and Brock Street near the new residence of John Wade.

There was some discussion on the \$500.00 Permit for Trailer Parks. After discussion, it was voted that the \$500.00 Permit for Trailer Parks be deleted from the charges for Trailer Parks in Central; as of Council Meeting of May 31, 1971.




