

SPECIAL CALLED COUNCIL MEETING
Monday August 31, 1998
Central Town Hall - 7:00 p. m.
105 Werner Street, Central, S. C.

Present: Mayor Stan Thompson; Councilmembers: Edward Reynolds; Frank Chaka; Joe Head; Keith Martin; Harry Holladay; Police Chief Joe Gibbs; Administrator Herbert Thompson; Clerk Grace Towe.

Mayor Stan Thompson called the Special Called Council Meeting to order.

Harry Holladay rendered the invocation.

1. CONSIDERATION OF ORDINANCES IN POSSESSION OF COUNCIL:

- A. Second reading of Ordinance #13-98-E to provide for filing dates appoint Poll Managers, Poll Workers and Polling Places for the Nonpartisan General Election to elect 3 Councilpersons.
Motion by Edward Reynolds, seconded by Joe Head to dispense of the full reading of the ordinance and adopt on second reading.
The vote was unanimous.

Motion by Frank Chaka, seconded by Edward Reynolds to move Item 4 from work session agenda to the Special Called Council meeting agenda. The vote was unanimous. This item deals with disposing of animal feces. Mayor Thompson read an ordinance #14-32 already on our books, Sec. 14-32 Refuse Prohibited which reads "no leaves, trees, limbs, brush, ashes, discarded building materials, or dead animals shall be deposited for garbage collection". Mayor Thompson suggested that after "dead animals" in the ordinance that "or animal waste" be added. With this minor amendment to the current ordinance should be inclusive for animal waste. Motion by Frank Chaka, seconded by Edward Reynolds to amend Ordinance #14-32. After discussion the vote was four in favor and two opposed. Keith Martin and Joe Head opposed.

Mayor Thompson called for a motion to adjourn the Special Called Council Meeting. Motion was made by Frank Chaka, seconded by Joe Head to adjourn. The vote was unanimous.

Present: Mayor Stan Thompson; Councilmembers: Edward Reynolds; Frank Chaka; Joe Head; Harry Holladay; (Councilmen Keith Martin and Bobby Busha were out of town on business). Police Chief Joe Gibbs; Public Works Director Thad Garrick; Administrator Herbert Thompson; Clerk Grace Towe.

Mayor Stan Thompson called the meeting to order at 7:00 p. m.
Harry Holladay rendered the invocation.

Minutes of the July 13, 1998 Town Council Meeting were presented. Motion by Joe Head, seconded by Edward Reynolds to accept as corrected in work session. The vote was unanimous.

Public Session: (30 minutes) No input.

Receipt and disposition of petitions: None

Report from Council Committees:

Edward Reynolds - Mr. Reynolds asked Chief Gibbs to report on the Watkins Street property and Chief Gibbs reported that he had not been able to contact the owner but is still trying to get in touch.

Mr. Reynolds discussed the purchase of a used fire truck from Clemson University. Mr. Reynolds made a motion to give Administrator Herbert Thompson authority to go ahead and purchase the truck and the motion was seconded by Harry Holladay. After discussion the vote was unanimous.

Joe Head - Water and Sewer - Mr. Head asked Thad Garrick, Director of Public Works to report on the Town's I&I problem and his plans for reducing the amount of infiltration that goes into our sewer lines during heavy rain fall. Mr. Garrick discussed the I&I problems reporting that we could never get rid of all the infiltration, but starting with the manhole repairs is a step forward. Thad noted that 25 manholes were complete with a material made for this kind of repair. He reported that another 25 manhole repairs would be needed and these 25 would be done by a new company and a new material. Motion by Edward Reynolds, seconded by Frank Chaka to go ahead with the repairs of another 25 manholes. After discussion the vote was unanimous.

Harry Holladay made a motion seconded by Joe Head for Mr. Herbert Thompson to look into the possibility of getting a better price for more than 25 manhole repairs. If the price is right it would be more feasible to contract for more than 25. After discussion the motion was unanimous.

Frank Chaka - Finance - Mr. Chaka gave the financial report with favorable conditions and noted that workers compensation was paid in advance.

Harry Holladay - Planning - Mr. Holladay inquired if there was anything new on the old school house. Mr. Holladay made a motion for Mr. Herbert Thompson to contact a realtor and initiate some action concerning the school, possibly to sell the property. This motion was seconded by Joe Head and after discussion the vote was unanimous. Mayor Thompson discussed the condition of the old roller mill, noting that it was becoming more of an eyesore than ever and possibly dangerous. Mr. Herbert Thompson stated that he would contact building codes to see if there is some action that can be taken in this matter.

Consideration of ordinances in possession of Council:

A. First reading of Ordinance 13-98 to provide for filing dates for the nonpartisan general election for the office of three (3) council seats. Motion by Harry Holladay to dispense of the full reading of the ordinance and adopt on first reading. The motion was seconded by Edward Reynolds and the vote was unanimous.

B. First reading of ordinance 14-98 to increase the annual fees for the Mayor and Council Members, effective January 1, 1999. Motion by Joe Head, seconded by Edward Reynolds to adopt on first reading. After discussion the vote was unanimous.

Administrator's Report:

A. Caboose to be used as a Visitors Center. Herbert Thompson reported that the caboose could be used as a visitors center but it would have to be made handicap accessible which would be costly. Discussion only.

Vickery Drive and Wesleyan Drive Sewer Projects and Hamilton Place Lift Station. Mr. Herbert Thompson reported that all sewer projects were underway. Hamilton Place lift station should be ready to turn the power on it sometime in the next week.

Mayor's Report:

Mayor Thompson expressed his appreciation to those who had submitted material for the next news letter. He announced that the Pickens County Municipal Association would resume next month and would meet at Norris. October will be Central's time to host the meeting.

Mayor Thompson requested to go into executive session for discussion of a legal matter within the zoning department. Motion by Frank Chaka, seconded by Harry Holladay to enter into executive session. The vote was unanimous.

After executive session Mayor Thompson recalled regular session to announce that no action was taken and no were votes taken in executive session.

No further business Mayor Thompson adjourned the regular session.
