

November 30, 1981
Special Council Meeting

Present: Mayor Summey, Pro Tem Chaka, Mr. Evatt, Mr. Porter,

- A. Mayor presented quotes on backhoe. Mr. Sims called attention to the new quotes on used equipment. He reiterated his preference to purchase used equipment if no other alternatives could be found.
A motion was made by Mr. Porter, seconded by Mr. Chaka to purchase the new John Deere 310 A. This was the recommendation of the committee if the Council felt that a new piece of equipment was needed.
Mayor, Porter, Chaka, Evatt in favor. Sims opposed.
- B. Mayor presented the loan situation. Administrator explained the need to borrow money to pay for the backhoe.
Sims stated that if the money could be invested for 30-60 days that he would be in favor of the loan.
Motion by Mr. Chaka to authorize the borrowing of money, seconded by Mr. Sims. Vote unanimous.
- C. Mayor read resignation letter of Mike Sanders as Municipal Judge. Administrator explained that a municipal recorder may not practice law in front of other municipal recorders or magistrates in the same county.
Motion by Sims, second by Mr. Porter to accept. Vote unanimous.
Mayor presented the name of Pam Deal to fill vacancy caused by Sanders resignation on an interim basis. Motion by Porter, second by Evatt to adopt. Vote unanimous.
- D. Mayor presented the question of Christmas ^{Bonus.} Administrator stated that it was budgeted.
Mr. Porter made a motion, seconded by Mr. Chaka to award a Christmas Bonus based on one weeks pay to all full-time employees.

Administrator's Report.

- A. Administrator presented an alternate contract to submit to the County in regard to responsibility of prison inmates.
Motion by Mr. Chaka, second by Mr. Porter to adopt. Vote unanimous.
- B. Administrator advised Council on the availability of the gym for the basketball through the generosity of the new owners. Mr. Evatt expressed concern about adequate heating.
- C. Administrator presented an exchange of labor with the developers of the Marr acreage. The proposal called for a trade of 1000.00 worth of sewer work in return for 1000.00 worth of water work by the Town. Motion by Mr. Porter, second by Mr. Chaka to accept. Vote unanimous.
